



ASU REOPENING

Safety First

All ASU employees, students and visitors are required to wear masks or face coverings while on campus. That includes:

- HALLWAYS
- ELEVATORS
- STAIRWELLS
- BATHROOMS
- OPEN WORK AREAS
- CLOSELY CONFINED **WORK SPACES**
- **CLASSROOMS**
- STUDY AREAS
- ANY TIME YOU'RE **WALKING ACROSS CAMPUS**
- AND FOR FACE-TO-FACE **MEETINGS OF ANY KIND.. EVEN IN LARGE SPACES.**





Phase One

Non-instructional staff will return to campus.

 ASU is a Mask Mandatory campus, which requires wearing masks or face coverings.

 ASU will provide one initial safety pack for students and employees. The pack will contain a reusable mask, wipes, hand sanitizer, and a thermometer.



Phase One

 Self-Monitoring of temperature and COVID-19 symptoms will be required of all employees.*

 Sanitizing stations will be available in central locations throughout the campus.

 Entry into buildings will remain minimal with signs designating points of entry and exit.



Phase One

 All face-to-face meetings must be held in compliance with social distancing of six feet for all participants or utilize virtual meetings.

- ASU ID will be required for all employees.
- Visitor access to the campus will be limited and prior approval for entry will be required.
- No public events will be held on campus during this phase of reopening.



Phase Two

- Continuation of Phase One
 - All employees will return to campus at the direction of their supervisors (may include teleworking).
 - Access to academic and student support services.*
 - Students will return to residence halls.*
 - Instructions provided for students enrolled in face-to-face courses, food services and dining instructions.*



Phase Three

- Continuation of Phase One and Two
 - Classrooms and common spaces will undergo continued configuration to promote social distancing.
 - Creative scheduling will be implemented to reduce large gatherings.
 - Public events and student activities on campus will be approved on a case-by-case basis.
