





Issues/Methods

Issue to be addressed: To elevate the educational mission of the institution, UNMC established the Interprofessional Academy of Educators in 2016. Designed by educators for educators, this interprofessional community strives to improve health professions education by encouraging curricular innovation, supporting educational scholarship & offering mentorship for early career and seasoned educators. **Method:** The inaugural class included a unique blend of medical scholars from 8 Colleges, 2 Institutes, Academic Affairs, IT Services, and Library Sciences. Members span a 500-mile wide campus. Eight SIGs foster interprofessional collaboration & scholarship. An academically diverse leadership team of five oversees the Academy.



Clinical Teaching

Fosters cooperation in the development & implementation of best practice, evidence-based strategies & tools for bedside & clinical teaching.



Curricular Design, Instructional Methods, Assessment & Evaluation

Provides expertise on design practices, instructional theory application, research tools & the utilization of appropriate assessment/ evaluation modalities.




Special Interest Groups (SIGs)

Simulation


Offers a network for simulation ideas & issues, support when adding simulation to curricula & expert insight on simulation technology.

Outcomes: The SIGs drive educational projects. Each Special Interest Group has a specific focus with like-minded members determining & accomplishing desired goals. In-progress projects include a peer-evaluation rubric for clinical teaching, a campus-wide technology inventory with recommended best practices, a wellness conference to recognize rural clinical preceptors & a premiere education banquet centered on critical thinking. **Conclusion**: The Interprofessional Academy of Educators is connecting scholars across the campus. A reflection on the

first year finds advancement of educational projects, more opportunities for innovation & improved collaboration for educational scholarship.


The Science of Learning

Rural Health Care Education


Committed to identifying, developing and promoting educational opportunities related to rural education.
